Things to Do in the Garden in June

- Continue planting drought tolerant plants •
- Plant bougainvilleas, perennials in bloom, succulents, • morning glories, and alstromeria
- Plant seeds of heat-loving annuals •
- Use bedding plants for instant color •
- Deadhead and pick roses and summer flowers •
- Prune Epiphyllums •
- Divide and repot cymbidiums
- Thin out fruit trees after June drop •
- Cut back euryops •
- Clip runners off strawberries •
- Give marguerites a butch haircut •
- Remove spent blossoms from daylillies
- Prune climbing roses once blooms have faded •
- Feed citrus and avocado trees •
- Check for chlorosis in citrus, gardenias, and azaleas and treat with chelated iron
- Fertilize veggies, perennials, roses, and lawns
- Fertilize camellias •
- Water all plants except for some well-established, • drought tolerant and natives
- Keep veggies watered, especially strawberries •
- Control slugs and snails •
- Watch for rose pests and diseases •
- Control gophers with the black hole traps
- Control weeds around plants with mulch
- Spray tuberous begonias for mildew
- Start harvesting veggies and enjoy



Ceci Bean Salad (Jeannie MacKinnon)

- 2 15 oz cans garbanzo (ceci) beans
- 1 cp chopped celery
- 1/2 cp chopped green peppers
- ½ tsp Italian seasoning
- 1/3 cp lemon juice
- ¹/₂ cp olive oil
- 1 tsp garlic salt
- ½ tsp sugar
- 1/8 tsp pepper

Mix ingredients all together and chill for a least one hour. Great picnic or barbeque side dish!
